As Jerry, KM6IBP, about the condition of the roads.

Briceland/Thorn road is destroyed so it was suggested that emergency vehicles use an alternative route through Shelter Cove Jerry, KM6IBP, also reported a building severely damaged but no fires. It was advised to have Fire Dept notified because of fire hazards serious enough to considered potential hot spots in the area.

Nancy Peregrine, KB6LAD, reports Whale Gulch has no damages or injuries. She said she would go out and check on the well being of her neighbors to be sure. She would then report any problem to Net Control

Jack Foster, KM6TE, reports an injured man in Garberville, but since he is close to the hospital he would take appropriate action

Sally Cambel, KG6FOL, reports widespread panic in Phillipsville. Net control suggest a central location, perhaps the general store could be used as a place for people to congregate while they calmed down. Sally, KG6FOL also reported a man down and bleeding. While waiting for ambulance to come, sheets

were used as bandages and appropriate first aid applied to stop bleeding.

She also reported two trailers destroyed with no injuries, just the families who lived in them are

homeless and frightened. It was suggested by Net Control that they be assisted to the general store to be treated for shock while the Shelter in Garberville is being notified on their behalf.

The author hope that this article has given the readers a clearer picture of the disaster preparedness involved in ham radio operation. These drills give hams a chance to learn new skills, hone the ones they already know, and to check their equipment so that should disaster strike, they will be equipped to help themselves and their communities survive.
